James M. Stockman has been involved with lighting and theatre for over 50 years, after graduating from the University of Massachusetts in Amherst, with an MFA degree specializing in the areas of Scenic and Lighting Design and Theatre Technical Direction. The next 10 years were spent rising through the ranks at various colleges, teaching Scenic and Lighting Design and Technical Direction and lastly, Industrial Safety. Retiring in 1977 Mr. Stockman bought and ran a hardware store on the coast of Maine for 3 years. It is at this time he embarked on his third and fourth career simultaneously as the first professional free-lance Lighting Designer and Theatre Consultant and Manufacturer's Representative in lighting and architectural materials.

On the death of his first wife the rep. business was closed and for the remaining years to date he has been doing Theatre Consulting and Lighting Design under the auspices of 2 business entities, J & M Associates and J & M Lighting Design, Inc. , specialized in lighting design for commercial, industrial, residential projects and a specialist in environmental lighting, expert witness and daylighting. He was the first and is currently the longest tenured Lighting Consultant in Northern New England.

His "hobby" and community service has been being a volunteer firefighter for 43 years and currently he holds the rank of Safety Officer for the Kennebunkport Fire Department. Mr. Stockman also, currently serves, as Board President of KEMS the local non-profit ambulance service in Kennebunkport.

He is in his 51st year as a member of the IESNA (emeritus) and a member of the American Society of Theatre Consultants (ASTC), NFPA and the International Dark Sky. Currently he sits on the RP-33 committee and have been part of the mentor program.
